GREAT BEALINGS EMERGENCY PLAN

AIMS & OBJECTIVES

The aim of the Plan is to give facts and contact points to enable swift action in the event of a community emergency or if a resident requires assistance

The objective is to provide a coordinated approach in an emergency or as we have experienced a pandemic to increase the resilience of the local community and ensure the safety and welfare of residents

Most people help one another in an emergency but residents willing to volunteer assistance in a coordinated way should contact the Emergency Plan Coordinator with details of any particular skills or equipment and their contact details so that a current list can be maintained.

For elderly or vulnerable people neighbour awareness can be critical so please be aware of those around you who may need assistance in times of emergency or prolonged adverse conditions and weather.

ACTIVATION OF THE EMERGENCY PLAN

In the event of a Community Emergency involving any **immediate threat to life** you should first **dial 999** for the Emergency Services (Police, Fire or Ambulance).

If there is **no immediate threat to life** but you have information likely to help the Emergency Services please **dial 101**.

The information in this Plan is designed to be used by any local resident whenever needed.

The Plan may also be activated by one of the responding agencies e.g.; the Local Council or the Emergency Services.

Activities by Volunteers named in the Plan will be covered by insurance arranged by Suffolk Coastal District Council when the Plan is activated by them or by the Emergency Services except for the use of motor vehicles which are the responsibility of the user.

GREAT BEALINGS EMERGENCY PLAN LOCAL RISK ASSESSMENT FLOODING

RISK ON THE COMMUNITY

- Flooding of local roads and footpaths
- Access impeded in and out of village and to people's homes and property
- Damage to homes and property
- People displaced/homeless
- Failure of services e.g.; sewerage; electricity etc.
- Crop damage
- Animal displacement e.g., horses, cattle etc.
- Vehicles stranded

ACTION TO PREPARE

- Flood warnings
- Road diversion signage
- Home flooding defences including advice and equipment
- Evacuation from flooded or at risk homes especially older people
- Temporary shelter and food for displaced families
- Alternative animal accommodation
- Drainage construction and ditch clearing

Note In the event of home displacement we have an Emergency Shelter plan in place included in this document for flood and other risks

WARNING! - POTENTIAL HEALTH RISK!!!

Remember flood water may contain sewage and has risk of contamination to property, footwear and clothing. Do not allow children to play in the floodwater. Walking through floodwater is dangerous due to unseen obstacles and raised manholes etc.

FIRE

IMPACT ON COMMUNITY

- Damage to property, crops etc
- Possible evacuation of immediate area to avoid smoke/fumes inhalation
- Damage to underground electricity cable access restriction

ACTION PLANS

- Phone 999
- Evacuate premises immediately and assist elderly and young people to vacate area
- Remove animals from areas of smoke
- For medical attention in large scale incidents contact St John's Ambulance Phone 0303 003 0106

- Inform Insurers as soon as possible who will arrange emergency repairs and temporary accommodation for policyholders

GREAT BEALINGS EMERGENCY PLAN LOCAL RISK ASSESSMENT SNOW/SEVERE FROST

IMPACT ON THE COMMUNITY

- Road closure or access impairment
- Public services disruption
- Utility services disruption
- Burst or leaking water pipes

ACTION PLANS

- Ensuring it is safe to do so. Remove snow build up from vulnerable roofs especially glass conservatories
- If local plumbers required, search on Google etc
- For road closure/diversion contact Suffolk County Council Highways Department Phone 0345 606 6171
- Inform Insurers of burst pipes or water/snow damage. They can arrange emergency action and repairs.
- For vehicle removal refer to local garage or AA, RAC, Greenflag if a member
- Remember to assist elderly or vulnerable neighbours in cold weather particularly with heating and food provision.

GREAT BEALINGS EMERGENCY PLAN LOCAL RISK ASSESSMENT

GAS MAIN BURST

IMPACT ON COMMUNITY

- Note that there is a high pressure natural gas pipeline running through the village
- Evacuation of surrounding area if leakage occurs
- Fire actual or high risk
- Vandalism or malfunction at Pumping Station on Hasketon Road causing leak or fire
- Accidental striking with agricultural or construction machinery or in road accident.
- Domestic LPG Gas Tank explosion or fire

ACTION TO PREPARE

- Pipeline position is marked at regular intervals on route through village including at road crossings.
- No dig areas in close proximity to pipe line
- No fires near pipeline or pumping station or domestic LPG Gas Tanks

ACTION PLANS

- Gas Board Emergency line if gas smell

GREAT BEALINGS EMERGENCY PLAN LOCAL RISK ASSESSMENT GALE/HIGH WINDS

IMPACT ON THE COMMUNITY

- Damage to property/persons
- Road access impeded by fallen trees or debris
- Power etc. cables damaged and supply services lost

ACTION PLANS

- Road blockages Phone Police 101
- Power Cuts Tel: 105 (free call) to report a power cut and for help and advice regardless of who your electricity supplier is.
- Inform your Insurance Company immediately most insurance policies cover storm damage and Insurers will arrange emergency repairs.
- Property damage emergency repairs check for local builders etc
- Tree or debris removal from the highway
 Call Suffolk County Council Highways Dept.
 Phone 0345 6066171
 (who have statutory authority to remove trees from the highway or a public Right of Way).
- Police will also arrange this Phone 101.

IMPACT ON COMMUNITY

- Road closure or access impairment
- Injury to persons or animals, livestock
- Property damage
- Chemical, oil or gas leakage from delivery vehicle
- Fire/explosion
- · Loss of utility services

ACCESS: there is no vehicular access within 50 meters of the church entrances. There is parking space for a maximum of 3 cars in the front of the toilet/storage block. The path leading down is narrow. The exit is dangerous, as it leads out on to a busy road. Emergency access would have to be via the double gate opposite the North porch, (currently unused and barred up) or via the 5 bar gate beyond the church shed. In both instances primary access would have to be from down by the bridge towards Boot Street. Gate is normally locked -it is the property of the Cranworth Estate,

The ELECTRICAL SWITCHBOARD is connected within a cupboard in the vestry – far right-hand side. The Vestry is at the west end of the church, through heavy blue curtains.

There is NO GAS, NO OIL, NO CHURCH TELEPHONE. MAINS WATER is laid on – there is an outside tap on the wall to the right of the North Porch.

MAJOR ITEMS to be cleared in the event of an emergency; two wooden chairs in the sanctuary (but they are chained to the wall). Frontals etc – in boxed cupboard right hand

Version 2: April 2021 side of the vestry. Fine linen – cupboard on the left-hand wall of vestry. The parish chest to the right of the altar is ancient.

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS:

The two SAFES (in the vestry) are very heavy, made of metal, very difficult to move and probably fireproof.

Most items have *microdot* protection, and *smartwater* is used on the lead on the tower roof. This tower is not easily accessible. The churchwarden has keys giving access to the stone steps/wooden ladders which lead up to the tower from inside. The bells are on the first floor.
